


Health Indicators: Breastfeeding Initiation Rates by SES Groups

Breastfeeding initiation rates were related to socioeconomic status (SES) both inside and outside Winnipeg: areas with higher socioeconomic status also had higher rates of breastfeeding initiation. In Winnipeg, just over 70% of women in the areas with the lowest SES breastfed their newborns, compared to almost 90% of women in the areas with the highest SES. In non-Winnipeg areas, only 57% of women in the lowest SES areas breastfed their newborns, compared to almost 89% of women from the highest SES areas.
