


Health Indicators: Injury Hospitalization Rate by SES Group

Injury hospitalization rates are strongly related to socioeconomic status, with children from lower SES areas having much higher injury hospitalization rates than children from higher SES areas. This relationship is particularly strong for children living in non-Winnipeg areas. For Winnipeg children, the injury hospitalization rate for the Low SES areas was almost two times higher than the Low-Mid SES areas and 2.3 times higher than the High SES areas. For non-Winnipeg children, the injury hospitalization rates for the Low SES areas was over two times higher than the Low-Mid SES areas and almost five times higher than the High SES areas.
