


Education Indicators: High School Completion by Winnipeg NC

The first graph presented here (5 yr grads + withdrawn) shows the percentage of students graduating and withdrawing within five years of Grade 9 enrolment, by the 25 Winnipeg neighbourhoods. We used their enrolment records to determine whether after five years they had: graduated ("Grad"); were in Grade 12 but not yet graduated ("Near Grad"); were still enrolled but after five years had not yet reached Grade 12 ("Continuing"), or; had not been enrolled for two consecutive years ("Withdrawn"). Rates of graduation within five years range from 90% to just over 20%, whereas withdrawal rates range from less than 5% to over 30%. The second graph (5 yr grads + all Graph) shows the percentage of students who were "Near Graduates" and who were still progressing through high school ("Continuing"). All graphs show the Winnipeg neighbourhoods ordered by SES, with the most advantaged neighbourhoods at the top of the graph and the least advantaged neighbourhoods at the bottom of the graph.
