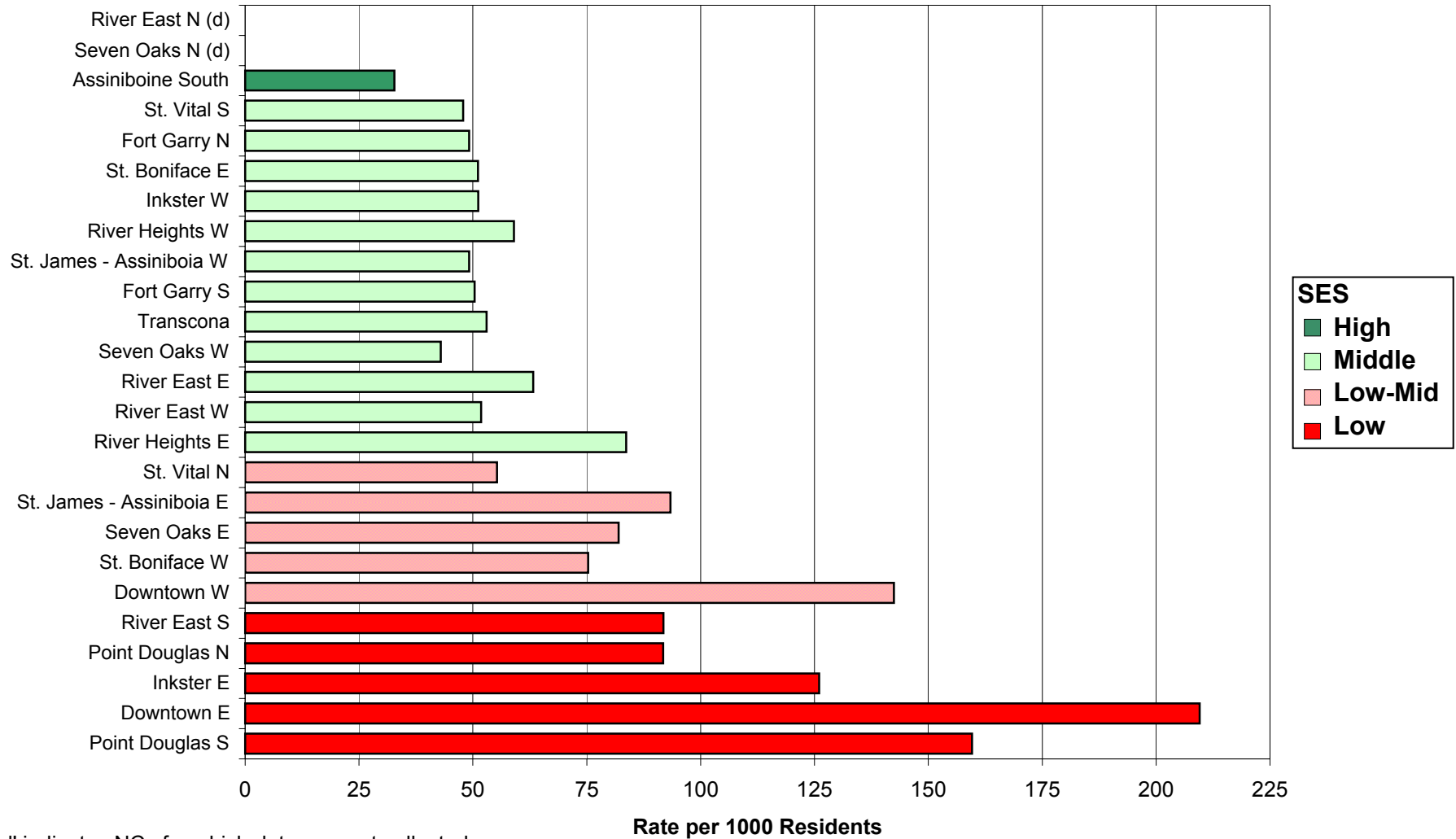

Community Resource Indicators: Rates of Crimes Against Property, by Winnipeg NC

The graph presented here shows crimes against property reported to the Winnipeg Police Service in the calendar year 1999. These data do not represent court proceedings, or even whether charges were ever laid against any individual. Rather, they show a record of crimes that have been reported to the police, which may, in fact, be an under representation of the actual level of crimes being committed in the communities. The graph shows that the crimes reported to police vary by neighbourhood SES, with fewer crimes reported in higher SES neighbourhoods (at the top of the graph) and more crimes reported in lower SES neighbourhoods (at the bottom of the graph). When compared to the crimes against persons graph, note that more crimes are reported to occur against property than against persons in all areas of the city.
