

Community Resource Indicators: Average Effective Age of Houses by Winnipeg NC

The graph presented here shows the average effective age of residential houses in each Winnipeg NC. Overall a trend by neighbourhood SES is apparent, with higher SES areas having newer houses. However, there are some areas that do not conform to this trend. For example, River Heights West and River Heights East have older houses than neighbourhoods with similar SES ranking, and Seven Oaks West and Seven Oaks East have newer houses than neighbourhoods with similar SES ranking.
