

Community Resource Indicators: Median Selling Price by Winnipeg NC

The graph here shows the median selling price of residential houses in 1999 for the Winnipeg NCs. Because all graphs in this report are ordered by neighbourhood SES with the highest SES neighbourhoods at the top of the graphs and the lowest SES neighbourhoods at the bottom of the graphs, variables that relate to SES are easy to see. Median selling price of residential homes is one variable that is visibly highly related to neighbourhood SES, as expected.
