




































#### Household income




#### Children in care





#### Children's injuries

By 2030, reduce the global maternal mortality ratio to less than 70 per 100,000 live births

By 2030, end preventable deaths of newborns and children under 5 years of age, with all countries aiming to reduce neonatal mortality to at least as low as 12 per 1,000 live births and under-5 mortality to at least as low as 25 per 1,000 live births

By 2030, reduce by one third premature mortality from non-communicable diseases through prevention and treatment and promote mental health and well-being











## Homelessness in Winnipeg

500 homeless participants in the Winnipeg At Home/Chez Soi Housing First Demonstration Project:

- 71% of Indigenous descent
- 77% substance-related problems
- 45% PTSD
- On average, participants reported six different categories of abuse/neglect before the age of eighteen
- 49% had been in foster care
- 42% had parents who attended residential school







#### **Toward a Long Term Plan to End Homelessness**

- A 15 member volunteer Task Force representing all sectors
- Guided by 5 Indigenous Elders
- Over 80 people who are or who have been homeless offered their voice
- 6 subgroups (prevention, person-centred system of care, housing supply, measurement, governance, action plan)
- Public consultations on key themes and involving all sectors
- Countless meetings and conversations

## We spoke with over 80 people who are or who have been homeless.

- "Growing up with my mother and my brother, we lived in a hotel. That is where we stayed. During that time, I honestly thought this was normal; when I was young, living in a hotel was normal. I thought going to Salvation Army or Siloam was normal."
- "When we look at a homeless person; that is someone's sister, mother, brother, aunt, uncle. We are all born good in the Creator's eyes. We all dream of being a fireman or a policeman or a nurse, ..."
- "I am thankful I have a strong little girl who is always one foot in front of the other and never gives up. I'd like to share a story. When we left the shelter, CFS took us to a hotel, my daughter said, "Thanks for having a big mouth, Mommy." I didn't know how to take it at the time. At first I was like "why do you say that?" She said, "Now we don't have to sleep there, we can sleep here." It was like night and day to her. She was so much better [she was getting sick in the shelter]."



## The Concept of a *System of Care* for individuals that are homeless or at risk of homelessness



Individuals in the community experiencing homelessness would start the process of accessing supports by presenting at a Housing Assessment and Triage Service site. A worker would assess that person's level of need using a standardized assessment instrument which would assign a value in terms of "acuity" of homelessness.

The service would also include diversion mechanisms to support those individuals who would not require the more intensive case management supports of the housing first/rapid re-housing programs.

# We believe an independent organization is needed to lead and coordinate a community-based plan to end homelessness.

- Indigenous leaders must be part of the decision-making
- The needs of people who are homeless must be central
- An independent, multi-sector board is necessary to bring all sectors to the table in order to drive the outcome
- A new organization must be lean but sufficiently and securely funded to drive the plan forward

## Winnipeg Street Census 2015

#### Where people stayed

On the night of October 25, 2015, there were at least

1,400

people experiencing homelessness in Winnipeg.






## Median Household Income




Median household income in dollars




#### **Readiness for School**












Percentage of children that are assessed as ready to learn when they enter kindergarten





Percentage of children in care





"The centre is really important. It has really saved my child's life more than once, cause I have somewhere to go when I can't do this anymore."

"I probably wouldn't have my kids if it weren't for this place".

"I'm being given a chance to parent my children."

"I grew up in foster care, my mom was alcoholic and in abusive relationships. Many of my foster families were abusive. It's hard not to carry that on with your own kids. Over the last four years, I've become a better mom. The transformation over the past four years is amazing. I feel empowered now. Being told every single day — you are good enough. There's nothing wrong with you. When you grow up feeling like you're not good enough, that's so important."
